Residents of the Bill of Rights Amendment eff. 5/28/2024 which states that it is unlawful to:

- deny admission to the facility, transferring, or refusing to transfer a
 Resident within a facility or to another facility, or discharging or
 evicting a Resident from a facility
- denying a request by Residents to share a room.
- where rooms are assigned by gender, assigning, reassigning, or refusing to assign a room to a Resident other than in accordance with the Resident's gender identity, unless at the Residents' request.
- prohibiting a Resident from using a restroom available to other persons of the same gender identity or harassing a Resident who seeks to use or does use such a restroom.
- willfully and repeatedly failing to use a Resident's preferred name or pronouns after being clearly informed of the preferred name or pronouns.
- denying a Resident the right to wear or be dressed in clothing, accessories, or cosmetics that are permitted for other Residents.
- restricting a Resident's right to associate with other Residents or with visitors, including the right to consensual sexual relations, unless the restriction is uniformly applied to all Residents in a nondiscriminatory manner, and
- denying or restricting a Resident from accessing appropriate medical or nonmedical care.

The provisions do not apply where they are incompatible with any professionally reasonable clinical judgment.
